This memo summarizes the process by which the attached Campus Diversity Statement was developed. During the 2017-2018 academic year, the Campus Diversity Council developed this statement after first seeking guidance from CSPP. The council then collected testimony from the faculty and staff senates as well as the student government. CSPP approved the final statement, dated April 7, 2018, and asked the council to forward it to the president's office. As a statement, rather than a policy, the Campus Diversity Statement reflects the current consensus among stakeholder groups, but can be changed at any point in the future. Should you accept this statement as recommended, it can be shared with the Board of Trustees as an information item.
