

## Global Engagement Council Meeting Minutes

December 10, 2018

3:00 – 4:30 pm

Present: Bradley, Dubrule, Grisson, Olson, Rodriguez, Wei

1. **Meeting minutes from November 7<sup>th</sup> meeting were approved with minor changes.**
2. Reviewed two courses for Liberal Learning:
  - The committee quickly reviewed the policies for how to count domains and civic responsibilities and agreed that we are only to recommend on the global piece within the civic responsibility category (the domain needs to be approved by the LLC)
  - a) BUS 360 (seeking global civic responsibility and domain of behavioral, social, or cultural perspectives) [the committee discussed the global civic responsibility only]
    - **GEC voted to recommend that BUS 360 be approved for global civic responsibility** – members felt that the global civic responsibility is infused throughout the course, reflected in the syllabus, and deepened by the textbook being used as well as the other assigned readings
  - b) WGS 237/CLS 237/CMP 237 (seeking global civic responsibility)
    - **GEC voted to recommend that WGS 237/CLS 237/CMP 237 be approved for global civic responsibility.** If this course is taught *as a study-abroad course*, it appears to meet the requirements for global civic responsibility through readings, lectures and on-site visits. The committee felt that offering this course on-site in Greece is critical to provide the ancient and modern global perspectives of Greek society (context reinforces the global perspective and the complexity of the modern society). It would be difficult to offer such a course without being on-site in Greece.
3. Highlights from the recent site visits to Germany (briefly provided by Christa)
  - Sites visited included the TCNJ Study Center in Heidelberg, ISA-FUBEST in Berlin, Beuth Hochschule University in Berlin and Goethe University in Frankfurt.
  - Targeted actions have been requested of the ESC team in Heidelberg Heidelberg to be completed during a probation phase. Once completed, a new 3-year agreement will be negotiated.
4. Other partnership work in development (Brazil, India, New Castle) (not enough time to discuss this; defer until first meeting in the spring)

5. Formal word on closure of CALC and proposed reorganization of CGE
- Details were shared with committee members that CALC will be closing (letter from President was discussed)
  - Reorganization will include combining duties of both CALC and CGE staff, as a result of cutting 2 staff members

Meeting was adjourned at 4:30 pm.
