Re: Report to Steering on 2019-2020 activities

Date: June 29, 2020

In 2019-2020, CSCC, consisting of largely new membership, considered a number of new and continuing charges from Steering, consulting widely with the campus community. CSCC should be poised in Fall 2020 to seek broader campus community input as appropriate on many of its charges and then make final recommendations to Steering.

I detail the status of each of our charges below and am happy to provide additional information as needed.

Electronic Records and	CSCC met with Aminah Massenburg, Privacy Officer, and

	sought input from the Council of Deans, Academic Leaders,

	Library. CSCC will need to gather input from the Faculty
	Senate in the Fall. CSCC can then solicit Tier II testimony and
	provide a report to Steering.
Naming of Assets and	After consulting with Steering, CSCC intended to move

	process charges. CSCC was not able to take any action of the

Safety of Minors on Campus	CSCC consulted widely with affected individuals and relevant
	stakeholder groups on this policy. CSCC met with Aminah
	Massenburg from the General Counsel's office, as well as John
	Donahue, Vice President for College Advancement. CSCC
	sought input from the Faculty Senate, Council of Deans, and
	Student Government. CSCC consulted with Sandy Gibson,
	IRB Chair. CSCC also consulted widely with department chairs
	and faculty overseeing summer programs in which minors
	participate. CSCC met again in April with Aminah Massenburg
	and discussed revisions she was considering to the interim
	policy in response to the significant concerns raised by CSCC's
	initial consultations with stakeholder groups. CSCC still needs
	to consult with Academic Leaders before seeking Tier II
	feedback and submitting a report to Steering.

Charge	2019-2020 activities
Student Organization Fundraising Policy	CSCC met with Sean Stallings, Vice President for Student Affairs in November 2019 regarding CSCC's proposal for an additional flow chart for the policy. CSCC members worked on revising flowchart in the spring. CSCC will follow up with VP Stallings before seeking Tier III feedback on the policy.
Social Media Policy	In the fall, CSCC reviewed Tier II feedback gathered in Spring 2019. Based on that feedback, CSCC sought additional feedback from Student Employment before sending questions and suggested to clarifications to Dave Muha, Associate Vice President for Communications, Marketing and Brand Management and Aminah Massenburg, from the General Counsel's office. CSCC is awaiting answers from General Counsel before making its final recommendation to Steering.
Student Conduct Code and Title IX Policies	CSCC met with the Division of Student Affairs and the Division of Equity and Inclusion in January 2020. As part of its data collection and consultation, CSCC reached out to many campus divisions and offices, including the Council of Deans, Academic Leaders, Department Chairs, Office of the Dean of Students, Counseling and Prevention Services, Career and Community Studies, Accessibility Resource Center, Campus Police, Religious & Spiritual Life, Faculty Senate Executive Committee, the Vice President for Human Resources and the EEOC officer. CSCC shared the valuable feedback we received from this process with the Division of Student Affairs as they revised the Student Conduct Code and Title IX Policies. CSCC planned to make its preliminary recommendations and seek Tier III testimony in Fall 2020.
Use of Campus Property	CSCC has consulted extensively with campus offices and organizations on this charge. Work on this charge began in Spring 2019. In 2019-2020, CSCC met again with John Donahue, Vice President for College Advancement and Aminah Massenburg, General Counsel's Office. CSCC consulted with groups not reached in Spring 2019, Academic Leaders and Student Government. CSCC is sending questions and suggested edits to General Counsel and CPUC.
