1. Announcements

2. edTPA/Certification Updates

- a. As of today, no guidance in writing from the State regarding edTPA for Fall 2020. Students who are able to do edTPA, should do it and submit it to Pearson. Flexibility is being provided to those who cannot do it – reasons being:
 - i. All of teaching is virtual and recording is not permissible
 - ii. One way virtual teaching only

- iii. In person teaching but fewer than 4 students in classroom
 - iv. Co-operating teacher unable to support and help them with edTPA
 - b. Local scoring can be done under certain circumstances instead of students paying for Pearson scoring. If students are able to collect data and do everything without getting a condition code, then they should do it and submit to Pearson. If students know they will receive a condition code ahead of them, they should not submit anything until they receive the code so that everything is submitted at the same time.
 - c. Discussion for students CER vs CEAS
 - i. Students can apply for CER and have up to 2 years to complete edTPA
