 - Joe notes that even standard policy review is time consuming and that even 25 reviews could take quite some effort
 - James hopes that the half or full day retreat will give opportunity to complete a large chunk at once as proof of concept
 - Jamal wonders how ownership of policy can be returned to responsible unit after this committee's review is complete, notes this puts CDC on the path to being primarily a policy review committee
 - James still views the review as being recommendation, not policing, and that implementation/improvement will remain onus of responsible unit
 - Will create paper trail for CDC/CSPP/others to check against in the future
 - James asks committee if they feel current process is sufficient to draft memo to
 Steering
 - Unanimous assent
