Virtual meeting taking place on Zoom

  - Absent: Student members Carr and Kornsgold.

### **New Business:**

- 1. New member welcome and introductions
  - No new members were present
  - Two students planned for this year but not present for the meeting:
     Cassidy Carr (Graduate Student) and Yaffa Kornsgold (Graduate Student)

#### 2. Elect new chair

- AG offered to be chair for this year but has a planned leave beginning Feb 2022
- LF offered to fill in for AG during this spring absence
- MD offered to be vice-chair this year with the plan to move to chair in Fall 2022
- AG self-nominated to be chair for AY21-22, seconded by LF, unanimous vote by committee in the affirmative. MD self-nominated to be vice-chair, seconded by AG, unanimous vote by the committee in the affirmative.
- 3. Non-matriculated credit increase discussion
  - Feedback from School of Nursing, Health, and Exercise Science- MD shared all faculty reported positive responses from nursing faculty to increase non-matriculated credits to 9 or 12 credits
  - MW shared concern for a student taking 9 or 12 credits without some oversight
  - MW gave example that a student could take 12 credits in one semester
  - ME reported nothing in place that prevents a student from taking >2 courses
  - KJ thought 3 or 6 credits is enough for a student to decide if they want to apply
  - ME shared may only transfer 6 if taking credits elsewhere
  - TC shared once matriculated, all would count at TCNJ
  - TC offered possibility that allows department to determine # of credits
  - Group agreed to keep credits as is for now and if any department wants a change, they can submit a formal request for it
- 4. Review of results of the marketing survey of current students/alum from spring

- TC shared four priority areas from the Provost
- TC reports want to expand graduate program degrees and certificates
- o TC reported revenue coming in is tight
- o TC reviewed Graduate Program Demand Study from Simpson Scarborough
- TC reports there are currently 7-10 graduate certificates in various stages of development
- LF shared the School of Ed is working on a stackable Masters Degree with some choices within own school and students earn MEd
- MW asked about online versus in-person interest. TC discussed interest in hybrid or online goes up a couple of years after graduation. TC suggests fully online not competitive and AG agrees
- TC suggests hybrid is the way to go and combining flexibility/in-person learning has the greatest potential
