  - a. Minutes approve: 5 in favor, 1 abstain.
- 2. Conversations with Faculty Leaders for Summer 2024 Programs.
  - a. 1:30 PM Rwanda (Matt Bender)
    - Matt introduces himself and program. He discusses non-matriculated participants. Importance of timing. Questions:
      - 1. How do we prepare non-matriculated students for this intense emotional plan?
      - 2. Who is second faculty member and how will they support recruitment?
        - a. Matt is committed to recruitment.
        - b. Second leader: need to pick someone who can be an advocate for recruiting and has background in genocide. Possible: Mindy McMann, Cynthia Paces, Kim Quick
      - Advertising?
        - a. Recruiting our students: study abroad fairs, reaching out to classes.
          - i. Maybe add grad section
          - ii. Maybe add 400 code.
        - b. Recruit alums: need virtual recruitment sessions
          - i. Tap into Rwanda communities in the state
          - ii. Alums as market to reach, but market could be bigger. Montclair State has genocide studies program: can reach out to their students or alumns.
      - 4. Moving forward: will you keep offering?
        - a. Possibly if it is a successful experience: every other year, every few years could be a good rotation
        - b. Other issue: how think about mixing of the cohorts, expanding the cohort? Useful experiment

    - i. Introduction: discussed the origins of course, the integration of science and art curriculum in the course, the importance of interdisciplinary study;

brought up the lack of science courses in the CGE offerings. This fills a void.

  - b. But there are mechanisms to take the course for major credit

  - b. Ran for approximately 10 years, every other year.
  - c. This year did not make recruitment, got expensive
  - d. This class will have reduced costs because of housing at field stations and hostels. This will reduce the cost.

  - a. Janet has reached out to field stations; they were very positive.
  - b. Looking into hostel for housing.
