- a. Discuss History Graduate Certificate Proposal
 - i. Dr. Michael Marino present to answer questions about the proposal:
 - Confirmed courses have not been created yet but in progress
 - Students may complete an interdisciplinary capstone in other areas
 - ❖ Appears as possible 18 credits on page 3 consider rewording
 - Research shows students prefer to be as flexible as possible suggest combination of synchronous/asynchronous
 - Some students may have concern for time flexibility suggests some asynchronous
 - Suggest online to draw wider net of possible students
 - Sequencing will be based on interest/plans couple of classes offered to see how it goes
 - ❖ Have some UG who are interested in grad courses
 - Order of courses can be flexible student members shared this has been helpful in their programs
 - Discussed recruitment plan
 - 1. Existing student body interest
 - 2. Some TCNJ who want graduate school
 - 3. Alumni and others draw more widely
 - 4. Practicing teachers
 - 5. Elementary ed who want middle school endorsements in social studies

- Consider highlighting MPS as a population

Old Business

Graduate Student Full-time Definition Policy

a. Review charge

- Reducing to 6 credits may make it more accessible to those who could not take 3-4 courses at one time.
- If there are scholarships from private organizations, they would need to be FT to be eligible.
- Will verify impact for international students
- Accelerated courses could be taking 4 courses so then you would be doubling the amount needed
- ❖ Most GSC suggest 9 for FT
- Students taking 5 or more credits can get financial aid -Discussed consider consulting with student affairs OR put in a statement that this is an academic definition and decisions about student affairs will be made by appropriate departments (i.e. housing and residential life)
- There will be an expansion of continuing education that may include graduate classes, degree completion, or summer pre-college classes – these will all be part of the continuing education enterprise.
- We recommend a policy that defines continuing education because we identified as a gap, but not appropriate to include here (deleted from red-lined)
